

Dear Chávez Parents and Community Members,

Elementary students in MMSD will attend a full day of school for the final day on June 13th instead of the early release at 10:00 a.m. in order to make up instructional time lost due to school closing for two snow days in December. The last day for 4K will now also be on June 13th. The Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction requires schools to meet statewide standards for number of days and hours of instruction during the school year.

Now that we have our allocation for next year we are starting to plan our Instructional Design. Instructional Design refers to the way we organize our school to ensure that every child has an excellent educational opportunity. Our Instructional Design must include and support the following beliefs:

- All students deserve the necessary support and opportunities to reach their full potential/succeed.
- There should be shared responsibility for each child between classroom and support teachers.
- Everyone is responsible for all children.
- Classroom groupings are heterogeneous.

You will be receiving the Parent Information Form for your child and it is due back by April 22nd. Do <u>not</u> add teacher names on this form. It is against Board Policy to request specific teachers. Also, please do not solicit teachers for information about placements for next year or verbally request a specific teacher. There is a process that the staff goes through to help make the best decision they can for **all** students in which we seriously consider each child's academic and interpersonal strengths and ensure that each child has academic peers. We are projected to have 643 students next fall with 30 classroom teachers allocated. We will have straight grades.

We appreciate your involvement in your child's education.

The Many Benefits of Exercise

Everyone can benefit from regular exercise. Kids who are active will:

- have stronger muscles and bones
- have a leaner body because exercise helps control body fat
- be less likely to become overweight
- decrease the risk of developing type 2 diabetes
- possibly lower blood pressure and blood cholesterol levels
- have a better outlook on life

Besides enjoying the health benefits of regular exercise, kids who are physically fit **sleep better** and are better able to handle physical and emotional challenges — from running to catch a bus to studying for a test. Consider walking or biking to school now that spring has arrived.

SCHOOL GARDEN NEEDS NEW LEADER

With the retirement of Dan Slick, the school garden, especially the vegetable garden, needs a new leader. With planting season upcoming, we need someone soon: not to do the initial planting, but to make that planting worthwhile by taking over in June, leading a group of kids in tending it, doing mid and late season plantings, and delivering the produce.

If we can go forward with the planting, this will be our third season. The first year we planted just before school got out and I mostly tended it myself. Last summer there was a group of about 6 kids who worked together twice a week and shared watering chores between times. The 20 x 20 foot garden produced about 250 pounds of produce each season which was delivered to the Second Harvest food bank. I've been told there is a food bank in Verona that will take our produce, so that might be a lot easier for delivery.

Is there an individual or group among staff or parents interested in taking on this project? Anyone who has gardened knows how satisfying it can be. If you've gardened with kids, you know that, too, is a good experience.
