DRESS CODE REMINDER

As the weather changes, students wear less clothing to accommodate the warmer weather. There is a close relationship between student dress and student attitude toward school. For that reason, the District Student Conduct and Discipline Plan prohibits "dressing or grooming in a manner which disrupts teaching or learning."

In order to encourage students to stay focused on class work and school, we ask that you assist us in helping your child comply with the district MMSD Policy 4211 dress code guidelines as well as the policy for Chávez. The following items are NOT allowed:

- Clothing which displays profane or otherwise objectionable slogans or graphics.
- Spaghetti straps, mesh shirts, backless tops, halter tops, tube tops, tops that expose the stomach area, sleeveless shirts that expose sides.
- Visible underwear.
- Clothing that is too brief or revealing.
- Clothing and accessories that depict gang behavior or glorify gang activity.
- Headgear: hats, bandanas, hairnets, scarves, do-rags, sweatbands, etc. No headgear unless special permission has been granted. (Headgear worn for religious reasons is allowed.)

A student who wears a shirt that is in violation of the dress code is asked to turn the shirt inside out or is offered a clean replacement shirt. A student who wears sagging pants is offered a length of string as a belt. In some cases, a parent may be called and asked to bring replacement clothing to school. Shoes must be worn at all times.

A student who repeatedly refuses to abide by the dress guidelines will be subject to disciplinary action.

End Of Year Medication Return

We would like to remind parents/guardians that they must pick up any remaining medications at the end of the year. No pills can be sent home with students. Medications not picked up by a parent by June 12 will be discarded.

Epi-pens, inhalers, and Glucagon may be sent home on the last day of school if we get permission from the parent/guardian. If you would like your child to carry their Epi-pen, inhaler, or Glucagon home on the last day of school, please call the Health Office at 442-2010. If your child is attending summer school it will be kept at Chávez during that time.

Mark your calendars for school enrollment on Thursday, August 22, 2013 from 11 - 6 p.m. in the LMC. Be here to enroll your child for the 2013-14 school year.

1. Locate your Infinite Campus username and password to access the online enrollment system.

- Your password is available from your school secretary before the end of the school year.
- Or visit mmsd.org/lostpassword to receive a reminder email.

2. Fill out the information forms and pay fees online ahead of time by visiting mmsd.org/enroll beginning on August 6.

There are many reasons to attend registration:

- We will be updating annual disclosure and demographic information on mmsdenroll.org
- Find out who your teacher will be
- Pay Annual Fees

- Sign up for 5th grade Strings (Additional participation and rental fees)
- New and returning students update enrollment and emergency contact information
- Receive Breakfast and Lunch Menus Put money in account
- Receive bus information

What to bring:

- Verification form and fee receipt, printed at the end of the online enrollment process.
- Free/reduced lunch application number if you have one.
- Verification of your address (gas/electric bill, lease or mortgage) if your address has changed.
